## To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WUEBERSON In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 50.243 for 100 acres, in favor of John Buk, Private, in Captain Marchis Company, New Ampshire, Multia, Way 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the west half, of the south cast quarter, and the east half of the south west quarter of vection Three, in Vourschip One hundred and twenty seven, of Range Thirty fire, in the District of Lande, subject to eale, at Saint Cloud, Minnessta, Containing, one hundred and support acres.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENEBAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, the said warrant having been assigned by the eaid, John Big to Charles & Bufs, in whose four, the said tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Charles & Bufe, is assigned, as a presaid, and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Charles & Bufe, as assignee, a apresaid, and, to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Abraham Lincoln PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
