To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled an "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, Warrant No. 29,551 for 160 acres, in favor of Pearson Hazelton, Quartermaster, U. S. Ship Congress, United States Navy, War 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon The South half of the North-West quarter, and The South West quarter of the North-East quarter, of Section Three, and The South-East quarter of the North-East quarter of Section four, in Township one hundred and twenty-seven, of Range thirty-five West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Saint-Cloud, Minnesota, containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** by the SURVEYOR GENERAL. The said warrant having been assigned by the said Pearson Hazelton to David B. Starnett alias David B. Starnett, in whose favor said tract has been located.

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said David B. Starnett alias David B. Starnett as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said David B. Starnett alias David B. Starnett as assignee as aforesaid and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Abraham Lincoln PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.

GIVEN under my hand, at the CITY OF WASHINGTON, the twentieth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and of the INDEPENDENCE OF THE UNITED STATES the eighty-sixth
